Free tax preparation for eligible Parkland employees

In partnership with Foundation Communities, Parkland is once again hosting free tax preparation events with IRS-Certified Preparers at various locations in the coming weeks. From 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. each Tuesday beginning Feb. 11 through March 18, all employees and their families making less than \$67,000 per year can qualify for this free service.

Appointments are required, so sign up in advance using the links below, and be sure to bring any required documentation (ID, W-2, Social Security, bank statements, etc.). Please note that your appointment should be scheduled during your lunch break or other personal time.

"Our department covers more than 25 ambulatory locations for medical and dental services every week, catering to patients from newborns to the elderly. Among all the nurses, Jen truly stood out.
