## ► DCHD PD offers civilian active shooter response training

The Dallas County Hospital District Police Department is offering in-person active shooter response training available to all Parkland team members. The trainings, led by Officer Darlene Griffin, Crime Prevention Coordinator, will take place on Thursday, March 21, and Thursday, March 28, from 8 – 9:15 a.m., 3 – 4:15 p.m. and 6 – 7:15 p.m. each day. The March 21 training session will be held in the Moody Outpatient Center 5th floor Classroom Q (MOC 05-458Q), and the March 28 session will be held in the Moody Outpatient Center 5th floor Classroom) H (MOC 05-454H).

Seating is limited to 40 attendees per session, so registration is required. You can register, either individually or as a group, by emailing <u>CrimePrevention@phhs.org</u> the date and time of session you wish to attend.

## Monthly HRO Universal Skills focus topic: Think Critically Using Validate and Verify

Having a questioning attitude is a habit of the mind that ensures our choices are best for the given situation. We do this by actively questioning information we hear if it doesn't fit with what we know. We are trying to detect information and incorrect assumptions that can lead to bad decisions or actions. Having a questioning attitude helps ensure we correctly perceive the conditions around us and that we choose the right response for the situation.





VALIDATE and VERIFY are attention tools that help combat knowledge-based errors and reduce the chance of making a mistake in a high-risk situation. We make these kinds of errors when we do not know what the right answer is and we proceed

- VALIDATE: When you interpret information or choose a rule from memory, ask yourself, "Does the information make sense to me?" You want to make sure the information fits with what you know to be right.
- VERIFY: Confirm the information with a qualified and credible source (e.g., policies, procedures, clinical protocols, reference manuals, expert individuals, leaders, chain of command, etc.)



#### VALIDATE and VERIFY are best used to:

- Avoid knowledge-based errors
- Increase attention to detail
- Double-check information when you don't know the right answer
