- Restorative care, such as fillings, scaling, root planning and corrective services (Copays apply based on your dental plan).

- Managing Ambiguity and Uncertainty (Tuesday, May 14, noon 1 p.m.): Learn more about one of our biggest stressors as human beings: the stress of uncertainty. While this is an inevitable part of life, this workshop will teach you strategies to better cope with ambiguity.
- Depression: Healing through Meaningful Relationships (Tuesday, May 21, noon 1 p.m.): Learn healing strategies to help navigate interpersonal difficulties and improve the quality of your relationships, which research suggests has a positive impact on the onset and persistence of depression.

On-stage/offstage access

Parkland Health facilities were designed around the on-stage/ off-stage concept, which separates the patient care and other areas that are accessible to the public (on-stage) from support areas not accessible to the public (off-stage). The public should not be present in offstage areas unless escorted by a workforce member. In addition, staff should only enter buildings using designated employee entrances. New chart correction reporting

There is a new way to inform the Data Integrity Team of medical record chart corrections. By using the HIM-MPI Support Activity, you can report items such as deceased patient notifications, suspected duplicate medical records, photo move requests or any other type of chart correction you discover. A user can access the HIM MPI Support Activity to send an In-Basket message regarding an issue to the HIM MPI Support Team for review and follow-up.

The HIM MPI Support Request Icon is located in the upper right-hand corner at the top of the Epic tool bar. The icon can be accessed from anywhere within the Electronic Health Record (EHR) after you have selected a patient.

Select the type of problem on the left side of the screen then fill out the information on the right side. Once you've filled out all of the required information, add your contact information and submit the request.
