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Celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month

National Hispanic Heritage Month efforts began in 1968 when California Congressman George E. Brown introduced the idea for a commemorative week that would recognize the contributions of Latinx and Hispanic communities to American history, achievements, and culture. Upon gaining support from Congress, Hispanic Heritage Week was signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson that same year. The week was later expanded to a full month under President Ronald W. Reagan in 1988.

The celebration is observed annually from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15. The Sept.15 start date is historically significant because it serves as the anniversary of independence for certain Latin American countries including Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. Additionally, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on Sept. 16 and 18.

This summer, Parkland began using robotic lawn mowers from Sensori Robotics on campus. These mowers are Al-powered and battery operated, which means there is no emissions/air pollution. They are also much quieter, which means a better healing environment for our patients. The automated mowers allow the landscape crew to focus on high-value tasks like trimming and edging while Al handles systematic mowing.

Plans are in place to go fully electric with all our landscaping equipment system-wide, so you may see these devices at your location in the future!
