Complete your Open Enrollment for 2025:

- You can enroll on PeopleSoft via <u>ParklandBenefits.org</u> or by visiting the <u>PeopleSoft site</u> from the SharePoint homepage.
- Once in PeopleSoft:
 - o Enter your password and User ID, which is your Parkland employee ID number.
 - o After signing in, click on the "Open Enrollment" icon.
 - Once you log in, you can watch the Open Enrollment Video and review your contact information and address. (Step 1-3)



What's new in 2025:

- For the second straight year, there will be no increase to your medical premiums in 2025.
- We are excited to introduce our new Cigna Healthcare Wellness Experience! Our wellness platform in your myCigna account will support your health journey and give you the opportunity to earn rewards up to \$100.
- As part of our wellness initiative, Parkland is a smoke-free campus. During Open Enrollment, all employees enrolled in the Parkland Employee Health Plan for 2025 MUST complete an attestation stating if they 1) are not a tobacco user, 2) are a tobacco user and do not intend to discontinue usage, or 3) are a tobacco user and will complete a tobacco cessation program before June 30, 2025. Beginning in 2025, a \$30 per pay period surcharge will be applied for staff who:
 - o Do not complete the attestation in PeopleSoft (surcharge will be applied starting Jan. 1, 2025)
 - o State that they are a tobacco user and do not intend to discontinue usage (surcharge will be applied starting Jan. 1, 2025)
 - State that they are a tobacco user and will complete a tobacco cessation program but do not submit documentation of completion by June 30, 2025 (surcharge will be applied starting after June 30, 2025)
- For spouses who have access to medical coverage from their employer but elect to participate in the Parkland Employee Health Plan, the Spousal Surcharge will increase from \$75 to \$100 per pay period.
- We are enhancing our infertility benefit and adoption assistance program with increased lifetime maximums.
- The Employee Assistance Program (EAP) is now consolidated under Cigna. Your annual EAP visits will increase from three to five per year. ComPsych EAP visits will no longer be available.

October HRO theme: Phonetic and Numeric Clarifications

Phonetic Clarification

 We make certain what we hear is what was intended by using phonetic clarification whenever there could be confusion. An example is, "There is a code in Neurology! That is Neurology with an N, as in November." Using the safety phrase, "as in" lets the listener know a phonetic clarification is coming.





Examples:

- A as in Alpha
- B as in Bravo
- Z as in Zulu

Use the Alpha/Bravo/Charlie phonetic alphabet chart, to clarify phonetic sounds when words may sound alike or be unclear.

Numeric Clarification

This is a deliberate effort to avoid confusion with numbers that sound alike particularly when communicating medication doses, critical lab values, equipment set points, or patient identification numbers.

Examples:

- 15, that's one-five
- 50, that's five-zero
- 425, that's the number four- two-five
- 4 to 5 that's the range four- dash-five
- Remember to always call out leading zeros: 0.9 that's zero-point-nine
