System Employee of the Year	<ul> <li>Non-hospital based, non-management employee who's achieved success in multiple roles in system work and personal life; sets high standards and serves as a role model; compassionate, sensitive and caring for patients and coworkers</li> </ul>
Physician of the Year	<ul> <li>Physician associated with the organization in an employed, non-employed or volunteer capacity</li> <li>Consistently demonstrates and verbalizes a commitment to patient-focused care</li> <li>Regarded as a role model and leader among other physicians and staff members</li> <li>Demonstrates integrity, compassion, respect, teamwork and personal accountability</li> <li>Physician has impressive achievements in community-oriented and/or humanitarian activities</li> <li>Must not hold a senior physician administrator or leadership position within the organization</li> </ul>

#### Get your flu shot by this Friday

The influenza vaccine ("flu shot") is mandatory for all employees and volunteers, with limited approved exemptions\*. To support the health, wellbeing and safety of our patients, guests and staff, please get your flu shot at Parkland by Friday, Nov. 15. You can get your flu shot from the following locations:

- Occupational Health Services (OHS-WISH)
- Employee Health Center (EHC-Moody)
- Designated Flu Drive locations listed below
- Preferred providers

#### Steps to receive your flu shot

- First: Complete the 2024 Seasonal Flu Immunization Survey in ReadySet.
- Second: Either get the flu vaccine or provide documentation of your current flu shot by 11:59 p.m. on Nov. 15.
  - Uploading documentation: If you get your flu shot from an off-site provider, ReadySet now allows you to upload your documents digitally. In ReadySet, navigate to the "My Health" tab, click on the "Documents" link, and then press the green plus sign to upload your document.
- Third: Apply the campus-wide flu shot sticker should be applied to your ID badge as confirmation of compliance. For more information, click the banner on the intranet homepage or contact Office of Talent Management at 469-419-3000 (ext. 73000).

\*Employees who do not receive the flu shot by the Nov. 15 deadline (or those granted exemptions/reasonable accommodations and who do not comply with the mask requirement will be subject to progressive discipline in accordance with <u>OTM Procedure 8000-100 Health Screening/Immunizations</u>).
