# Prepare for the Workday move



## **Prepare for the Workday move**

Pathways Learning will move to Workday on Thursday, Jan. 1, 2026. This new system will make it easier to manage your career, learning and development in one seamless experience. But before we flip the switch, there are a few important things you need to do and know now. Pathways will become "read only" on Wednesday, Dec. 10. Plan accordingly!



#### What do I need to do now?

- 1. Complete required training still on your Pathways learning plan.
- 2. Register now for classes that you want to take between Wednesday, Dec.10, 2025, and Thursday, Jan. 15, 2026.
- 3. Download your Pathways Learning transcript. Get instructions here.
- 4. Download certificates you may have earned with CEs from Pathways Learning and/or HealthStream (if applicable).
- 5. Complete outstanding competency checklists.

#### What do I need to know?

- Assigned Learning: Any optional training you assigned to yourself or was assigned to you in Pathways will not transfer to Workday. Required training may be reassigned in Workday Learning but progress will not transfer.
- Learning Transcript: Your Learning Transcript (complete Learning History) will NOT transfer to Workday. Transcripts will be archived and, under certain conditions, available through an IT Incident Ticket request.
- Class Registrations (2026): Classes you have already registered for in 2026 will transfer over to Workday. You will not need to re-register.
- Class Registrations (2025): Effective Dec. 10, refer to the remaining 2025 class offerings list below and reach out to the instructor directly to register.
- Competency Checklists: You will not be able to access a checklist from Dec. 10 until Jan. 1. You must complete these on paper and file them in the department.

We're counting on everyone to complete their tasks on time so we can hit the ground running. Let's make this move together with confidence, clarity and maybe even a little excitement!

#### December 2025 class offerings

Need to register for a class but Pathways is down? Reach out to the instructor directly to make plans to attend a class. Due to limited class sizes and waitlist procedures, employees should not show up to a class without first reaching out to the instructor to guarantee that space is available. # Sign up to volunteer at the Dallas Holiday Parade!



Parkland employees once again have the chance to volunteer at the annual Dallas Holiday Parade on Saturday, Dec. 6. Family members can also sign up to volunteer but must be a minimum age of 13 years old and if under 18, must be accompanied by an adult while volunteering.

This training session will be led by Dallas Holiday Parade officials and is mandatory for all parade volunteers. ## **Vocational** and technical colleges now included in **Parkland Auxiliary Scholarships**

The Parkland Health Auxiliary is expanding eligibility for its Steffen-Aronoff Scholarships to include vocational and technical colleges. Beginning with the Class of 2026, high school seniors whose parent or stepparent has been employed full-time at Parkland for at least one year can apply for a scholarship to support their post high school education.

Vocational and technical colleges provide students with a faster path to employment, affordable education and handson training in specialized career fields - benefits that can lead to strong employability and long-term financial stability.

Scholarship applications will be available starting Monday, Dec. 8, 2025, through Friday, Feb. 27, 2026.
