Murals create a peaceful environment at C.V. Roman **Health Center**

Trees have a magical way of creating peace and calmness, especially as they are expressed through art. In August, new murals were installed in the pediatric behavioral health playroom and the waiting area at Parkland's C.V. Roman Health Center. The artwork displays trees on hills and blue skies with white clouds. There are lights within the images illuminating the horizon of trees creating a friendly green glow.

These beautiful murals are possible thanks to philanthropic support for pediatric behavioral health services at Parkland. The trees are a welcoming sight to anxious young patients and represent one way therapists and other staff can integrate behavioral health and trauma informed care into pediatric primary care services.

Parkland's staff wants screening children for behavioral health issues to feel as common as vision and hearing tests. The program focuses on mild to moderate behavioral health needs through Parkland's network of community clinics. From October 2021 to June 2023, 2,923 children were served through 7,974 visits. Parkland's goal for the future is to increase capacity and continue reducing the stigma around behavioral health treatment for pediatric patients in areas of highest need in Dallas County.

and brief. But there are some ladies who are always pleasant even when things are not. I've been in customer service for over 15 years and I know the discipline it takes to be courteous all the time, regardless of what is going on. It's not that easy when you are being pulled in every direction to remain focused and kind to others. I don't know their faces or full names. I only know them as Mo, Gabby, Ashley, Patty and Jerry. I can't say enough of their kindness and patience with Guest Services Representatives when we have to call over and over. I hope someone is telling them 'good job' because they all need to hear that. And even though I know this isn't possible, I wish someone could give them all 'neck massages' to smooth out the stress bumps!"

Pricing change for Maple Garage charging stations

Beginning Friday, Dec. 1, pricing will be updated for Parkland's electric vehicle (EV) charging stations, located in the Maple Avenue Garage. Employees, patients and visitors will be able to pay a discounted rate using the below codes:

Driver Group	Rate	Connection Code
Parkland employees	\$0.15/kwh until charged then \$2/hr after 2-hour grace period	20152015 (the year NPH was built)
Patients and visitors	\$0.20/kwh until charged then \$1/hr after 2-hour grace period	18941894 (the year Parkland was founded)
All other drivers/public	\$0.35/kwh until charged then \$2/hr after 30-minute grace period	N/A

Please do not share the employee code with anyone outside of the employee workforce. Patients and visitors will be able to get the code from clinic staff.

Payment can be made using the charging station app. For help or with entering the code, please contact Chargepoint via their app or their 24/7 customer service line at 888-758-4389.

System policy SYS.BOP.018 "Campus Parking and Regulations" has been updated with the fees and to better define expectations for users of the EV charging stations. We appreciate your understanding and the ongoing use of EV charging.
