December HRO Theme: Ask Clarifying Questions

Have you ever walked away from a conversation and find the details a little unclear? Asking clarifying questions is designed to help avoid these uncertain situations or when you need a better understanding. The probability of making a wrong assumption is reduced 2.5 times when you ask 1-2 clarifying questions.1

Clarifying questions can be asked:

- In high-risk situations.
- If information is incomplete or ambiguous.
- When you are unsure.

Make it easy for others to speak up by using these safety phrases:

- "Let me ask a clarifying question..."
- "Do you have any clarifying questions?"

Asking questions is a key part of developing situational awareness. Parkland is committed to creating an environment where it is always safe and encouraged for anyone to ask questions. Alaris Fleet Remediation Project

The Alaris Fleet Remediation Project Team will begin replacing Alaris pump modules on Tuesday, Dec. 3 through Friday, Dec. 13. We are replacing Alaris PCU, LVP, PCA, Syringe EtCO, and SPO2 modules. Each new module will have a pink triangle sticker to help identify the new modules. The new modules are NOT compatible with our existing modules. Clinical areas should already have a Single Point Lesson (SPL) and updated cleaning requirements where necessary. Contact your supervisor if you need this information. You will be able to track Alaris modules with our new Securitas MobileView asset tracking application from Workspace. MobileView has integration with Alaris to show the location of the modules at all Parkland locations as well as provide the status of the Alaris pumps, i.e. Idle, Pumping, etc. If you have any questions about MobileView or Alaris modules, contact Clinical Education, Clinical Engineering or Supply Chain Equipment Garage.
